III. Preparing the event

This year, our inscription in SFD website was the second one, and that's why we were convinced that we have to work so hard and under pressure to make the event successful and better than last year. Points below describe more our strategy and work to prepare the event:

1- Weekly meetings

The idea was to make weekly meetings to discuss the preparative evolution, to decide and to affect different tasks to different teams. The meetings were every Wednesday at 6 o'clock PM around a cup of coffee in "Apache". In total we've made 8 global meetings and other local meetings between smaller teams.

2- Tasks

On the first meeting we've decided the tasks and the global program of the journey but not in details. What we had to do in the event day was:

- ➤ Workshops: present some OS applications and GNU/Linux distributions.
- Technical Data Sheet: for each workshop a technical data sheet must be prepared to describe the workshop.
- Presentations: present SFD event, Open Source and thematic conferences discussing the action domains of OS.
- Competitions: prepare QCM sheets related to information presented in workshops. A challenge between best community contributions in Free Open Source Projects and a game under Linux challenge. Give prizes to winners in each QCM competition and the challenge.
- > T-shirts: design and prepare our local T-shirts.

- > Pens: prepare pens on which is printed Digital Free Software Association (in Arabic)
- Brochures and badges: design and print SFD and DFSA brochures and badges for organizers. (see attached)
- Poster: design and print posters. (see attached)
- Mailing list: we activate the last year mailing list to communicate with each other: <u>SFD_Tunisia@googlegroups.com</u>
- Radio: a team must animate the journey via a local radio

V. The Event

In recapitulation the event was organized in three steps: 4 months before, one day before and the day of the event. The first period, from 17th July to 25th October, was described above.26th and 27th October will be described below:

1- One Day before: 26th Sept

The 26th September at 3 o'clock PM most of the members were on site to prepare the place, to take their T-shirts and to install different systems and applications. In conclusion we were there from 3 to 00:30 AM to make the site ready to accommodate the visitors.

• Assembling PCs

Our sponsors "Versus" and "Microlux" provided us with 30 PCs. Every workshop responsible has taken necessary number of PC to assemble it. (See photos)

• Installing Systems and applications

Every workshop team had the choice to install the Linux distribution he wants or he can use a live one. But the distributions most used are Ubuntu, Mandriva, Fedora and Suse.

Others had to install some different application such as Apache, Eclipse, Samba, etc...

At 9 o'clock PM everything was ready. We closed doors, went at home sleeping well to have enough energy for the big day.

2- The Big Day: 27th October

On 27th October at 9 o'clock all members were on site. Each one took his place made the last changes and was waiting for visitors.

- **Community contribution evaluation :** There was a kind of competition between open source projects done and presented by our community members, they were presented in "contributions workshop" and the evaluation was done by some experts, the first winner was "NetChat" and the second one was "Morched Tarbawi"
- **QCM:** there was one QCM competition. Questions are general and dealing with everything in the journey (Open Source, workshops, Conferences...). The examination room was full of participants trying to answer QCM and win prizes (see photos).

• Event Distinctions :

First, we had the chance this year to have as visitor Mrs. Khadija Ghariani, Secretary of State in charge of IT, the Internet and Free Software, she was really proud of our event organization and she promised us more and more help to heal the free software community of Tunisia.

Second, one of our sponsors is Trainux which is Master LPI affiliate, for the promotion of exclusive products LPI in the Maghreb (Tunisia, Algeria, Mauritania and Libya). TraiNux guarantees and the criteria of relevance, quality, neutrality and support of LPI. Trainux organized a special examination session for the LPI Exam, which was a low cost payment, to give the students a chance to get their LPI certification.

Third, there was an effective presence of two of our national newspapers "<u>echorouk</u>" and "<u>assabah</u>" and they did interviews with some of the organizers and they will publish their articles soon, there was also a possible invitation for a TV emission interview later.

• Closing and Prizes presentation

At 5 O'clock PM workshops, presentations and competition have finished. It's time to close and to announce winners and to offer them prizes. The ambiance at that time was really excellent. Diplomas will be delivered later for the winners and organizers.(see photos)
